## Policy

The Council of the County of Two Hills passed Bylaw No. 15-90 known as "The Parks Control Bylaw". The designated areas where the Bylaw is effective are at the Parks known as Sandy Lake, Jackfish Lake, Lac Sante and Little Moose Lake.

A person who enters a Municipal Park shall comply with any lawful orders and instructions made or issued pursuant to the Bylaw.

### General

Council may

- a) Subject to the Highway Traffic Act, and the Municipal Government Act, control and prohibit the movement of vehicular, pedestrian and other traffic by means of signs and notices designated and erected.
  - b) Designate and erect other signs and notices governing and prohibiting activities that are provided for in the Municipal Government Act or the Bylaw.
  - c) Under the Bylaw appoint a Park Supervisor for the purpose of enforcing the Bylaw.
- Quiet time in the parks is 11:00pm to 7:00am the following morning.

### Animals

A park supervisor may refuse to admit to a Municipal Park, or require to be removed from a municipal park any animal if he considers it is not under the control or may be a nuisance or a danger to the life, safety, health, property or comfort of any person in the municipal park. The park supervisor and/or peace officer may prohibit the entry of a vehicle into any part of any municipal park.

### Camping

The municipal council may provide for and designate areas within the municipal parks for camping and day use purposes and may set fees or sell permits for use in these areas.

### Enforcement

A park supervisor or peace officer may cancel a camping permit without prior notice to the permittee if the permittee contravenes this bylaw and the permittee shall vacate the park within one (1) hour from having been requested to do so.
